## Pastor's Message

### Loved Beyond Measure

If you were to ask me what my favorite color is, I would tell you that it's yellow. Yellow is bright, happy, warm, cheerful. Whenever we want to include the sun in our drawings, we go for the yellow crayon. If you were to ask me what my favorite day of the church year is, I would tell you that I don't really have a *single* favorite, but that there are some that hold a special meaning for me - some that I connect with more deeply. Based on what I just said about my favorite color, you might be surprised to hear that one of those days is Good Friday. After all, if you've ever been to a Good Friday worship service, then you know that it doesn't include yellow.

On the other hand, if you've ever been to a Good Friday worship service, then you know the things

that it does include. Good Friday includes words of grace and love and faithfulness. This year, those words will include these passages:

Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise." - Luke 23

When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home. - John 19

of God, is the color that  
holds our life.

As we read through each chapter, we learn by 'overhearing' a question / answer conversation between two people. Our study will be "Making Sense of Martin Luther". I've heard a number of Hope's members express interest in learning about what we believe as Lutherans. As we explore Martin Luther, his teachings, and the context of the Reformation, we will gain a firm understanding of what Lutheranism is, and what it means for our life.

### About the Altar Guild at Hope

Hope's Altar Guild is made up of a group of members that faithfully and reverently prepare our worship space and worship materials so that we can move smoothly through worship and, through the care that is taken in preparations, see that we understand worship to be a holy time of God's presence and grace. The Altar Guild is not a Committee at Hope, so participation seldom requires gathering for a meeting. The activities of the Altar Guild are guided and overseen by Hope's Worship and Music Committee. Weekly activities include setting out the bread, wine, and grape juice; placing hymn numbers on the hymn board; neatening and restocking the various resources in the pews; clearing the altar and washing the communion ware after worship; checking if a robe has been set aside for laundering and, if so, bringing home to be washed. The Altar Guild is also responsible for occasional activities such as changing the sanctuary hangings when necessary. As there are a number of people on Hope's Altar Guild, all serve on a rotating basis so no one member is burdened. No special training or knowledge is required to begin serving on the Altar Guild. ## Serving Our Savior

Serving Our Savior; you might have heard of it by the name SOS. Serving Our Savior's mission is to lend a helping hand to individuals and families of all sizes who are below the poverty line by offering them wholesome food and clothing.

Each week about 50 volunteers gather to distribute food to about 125 families. In 2018, SOS provided 181 tons of food to 6,500 families and nearly 19,000 people. On Wednesdays, volunteers pick up food and stock it for distribution on Thursdays. Each family may receive food every other week. At Thanksgiving and Christmas SOS gives out turkeys and at Easter, hams.

Founded 22 years ago, SOS is now a consortium of ten churches, including Hope Evangelical Lutheran Church. The other participating churches are: Shepherd of the Hills Episcopal, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church (where the food pantry is located), Unity Church of Citrus County, Joy and Praise Fellowship, House of Peace, House of Power, First Church of God, Hill Baptist Church and Church Without Walls.

There are many ways to help SOS in its mission with our donations and volunteer hours.

On Wednesdays, help is need to unload, sort, and prepare food for distribution. Just show up in the parking lot of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, 439 East Norvell Bryant Highway (SR 486), Hernando between 7 and 7:30 am. A typical day is from 7:30 to 10:30am, although any hours you can donate will be appreciated.

On Thursdays, help is need with handing out food, pushing carts for the recipients, and helping with the administrative side and clean up. The pantry is located at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. To volunteer, sign in as a volunteer in SOS's office at Good Shepherd and you will be assigned where needed. A typical Thursday runs from 8am to as late as 11 or 11:30am but come between those hours and stay as long or short as you are able. Many of the recipients volunteer their time while waiting to be served. As the day moves on and they receive their food and leave, there is a shortage of volunteers later in the morning.

Volunteering at SOS is like joining a family of warm, caring folks who always have a welcoming smile for you.

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## Serving Our Savior (cont.)

On Sundays help is needed from one couple or two people working as a team to pick up bread from Panera's in Inverness at 9pm. Containers used for pick up are located at Shepherd of the Hills Episcopal Church, 2450 West Norvell Bryant Highway, Lecanto FL. The task involves picking up the containers on Sunday and arriving at Panera's around 8:45pm. The staff will load the bread into the containers and place them in your car.

The bread is then driven to Shepherd of the Hills and left there for delivery to the pantry. Please contact John Bourdeaux at 352-422-2429 if you can help or have any questions.

Hope Lutheran is currently supporting the need for diapers at Serving Our Savior. The cost of diapers has made it difficult to continue this ministry without our help and generous giving.

To donate directly to Serving Our Savior, checks may be written to SOS, Inc. and mailed SOS, Inc., c/o Mary Krol, 1289 North Hunt Club Drive, Hernando FL 34442. Donations of food may be left in the basket located in the narthex and marked for SOS.

Another way to support SOS is to attend their two annual fund raising efforts. The Father Christmas Ball is held in early December and is its largest fund raising event of the year. It features dinner, music, a silent auction, and dancing. A deserving recipient who demonstrates the

highest level of service to the community is honored annually and named Father Christmas. A golf tournament supporting SOS's mission is held at the end of February each year,

Gently used clothing donations are always appreciated.

By joining our efforts with the other nine churches that comprise Serving Our Savior, we at Hope, are able to have a greater impact helping those in need in our community.




