Message From Pastor

What does it mean to you that you are a baptized person? Don't just read on: take a moment now to think about that question. I'll wait. J

Those who were baptized as infants had their parents make promises for them, until they were able to "affirm" their commitment to Christ at Confirmation. Those who were baptized as older children and adults made their own promises at baptism. The promises are the same: (Pastor Lynn paraphrase) to spend time with God's people, to attend worship, to share the good news of Jesus with others in what we say and do, to serve others, and seek peace with justice.

Even if you have never personally stood at the font with the person being baptized, you have been asked the sponsorship question: "People of God, do you promise to support (name/s) and pray for

them in their new life in Christ?" And you answered, "We do," along with the rest of the gathered assembly. What does it mean to you to be a Godparent or baptismal sponsor? Don't just read on: take a moment now to think about that question. I'll wait. J

Some Godparents take their role seriously. Mine did. When I was about thirteen, my Godparents said to my parents, "Shouldn't Lynn and Dave be in Confirmation class by now?" That fall, my brother and I were enrolled in class, and sat in the front pew with other members of our class taking sermon notes.

My Godparents were present at many of the big moments in my life, though not all of them. I always knew they were there, praying for me. It's probably because of their prayers that I allowed God to enter my life and lead me, one step at a time, into ordained ministry. They were present – unannounced – at my

Above all, they helped me develop a faithful, trusting relationship with God and God's people.
