A Message From Pastor

Chocolate candy! It's everywhere, in my file cabinet, in a dish on my desk, in gift boxes, also on my desk.

I have always joked about never, ever, fasting from chocolate. This year I actually challenged myself to fast from chocolate candy during Lent. Note, this fast never excluded chocolate cake or brownies, just candy. I could have made it easier by hiding all of it, but I wanted it to be a true challenge, so I left it where I can see it often.

It calls to me. You can have just one. Just one won't be so bad. How about fasting only during the week and not on Sundays? After all, Sundays are supposed to be a break from fasting.

But I decided to do this fast for the duration, and I am determined to keep the fast. I also didn't want to tell anyone about this fast, in case I couldn't even

get past the first week with it. I didn't want anyone to know I had tried and failed to do something as simple as not eat 3 or 4 pieces of chocolate a day. So far, so good. I have a month to go, and I think now I can make it to the end.

I'm sharing this with you, not because I want you to tease me by offering chocolate or excuses to eat chocolate, but because it's been an interesting process. First, there was the worry about failure; I had so little confidence in myself that I could discipline myself to avoid chocolate candy and resist its call to me to enjoy it. Then, there was the fear of ridicule if I tried and failed, and "everyone" knew it.

So, I caught myself in the familiar trap of expecting myself to be perfect, in this relatively small (Continued on next page)

Martyr Moments

Perpetua and Felicity
March 7, 203

Saints Perpetua and Felicity are Christian martyrs of the 3rd Century. Perpetua (born around 181) was a 22 year old married noble and a nursing mother. Her co-martyr Felicity, an expectant mother, was her slave. It is unknown how Perpetua became a Christian but it caused a bitter conflict with her father. He wanted her to recant, and when she refused, upon being baptized, she was moved into a prison. After bribing a guard she was moved into a better part of the prison where she was able to nurse her baby. Her father continued

to plead for her to recant but Perpetua remained steadfast in her faith. She was brought to a hearing before the governor Hilarianus and both martyrs confess their Christian faith. After Felicity gave birth the martyrs were led into an amphitheater, scourged and wounded by wild animals and then sword all in celebration of Emperor Geta's birthday. The martyrdom of Perpetua and Felicity is the earliest account of such by women.

Our church and faith is built on those that have gone before us.

Deacons Corner

What do Deacons do? Deacons work for Jesus Christ under the direction of the pastor.

How do they do this? The deacons are the ears and eyes of the pastor. Have a problem? Know of a problem? Our part-time pastor isn't always available SO...talk with a deacon. They are ready, willing, and able to

be a guide and inspiration. Don't be shy-deacons are folks just like you but highly trained. Use them. Our deacons are John Chiappetta, Diane Kahler and Ted Polack. They are available all the time - 24/7 - to the Glory of Jesus under the auspices of the pastor.

Chancel Did You Ever Wonder...?

Did you ever wonder what a Chancel was? The third main section of liturgical space is the chancel, a raised platform in front of the nave. Most worship leadership is conducted in the chancel, since it is the usual place of both the proclamation of the word and the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

In much traditional architecture, the chancel is composed of two parts: the sanctuary and the choir. The sanctuary is the altar area and is usually raised above the level of the rest of the chancel. (The term sanctuary is often erroneously used to refer to the entire worship space of a church, but this usage should be avoided.) Technically, the choir is the

remaining area of the chancel, but the term is becoming less helpful since the singers are often seated elsewhere than the chancel in modern churches, such as ours.

The furnishings of the chancel are then centers of liturgical action. Primary furnishings are the altar and pulpit; additional furnishings may include the lectern, sedilia (seats in the chancel for worship leaders), credence (shelf or table at chancel wall which hold sacramental and offering vessels), prie-dieu (a French term for "prayer desk) used for the Litany and in weddings and alter rail. The font may also be in the chancel.
